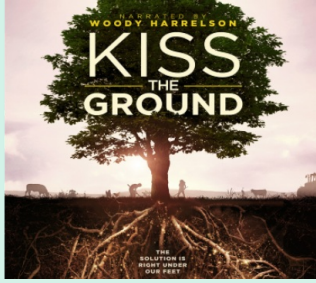

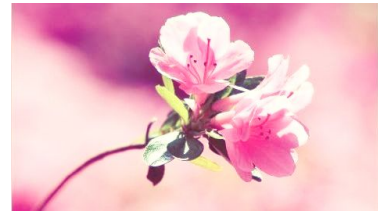

The Mission Committee will hold its last drive-by "Drop in the Box" on Saturday, May 1.

Our congregation and friends were very supportive in helping the SVCM restock their food shelves with 64 boxes of canned goods and non-perishables.

PLEASE NOTE: On May 1st the "Drop in the Box" will focus on personal care items, toilet paper, dish washing soap and laundry detergent. This will be our last DITB until next fall so let's make this a big one.

You may drop off your boxes on May 1 between 10:00 to 11:30 A.M. at the side entrance of the Anderson Auditorium where friendly, masked volunteers will receive your donations.
